* URGENT*ARE YOU ON AN ECONOMY 7 OR 10 ELECTRICITY METER? Time is running down to 30th June when these meters will not be able to switch between day and night time rates. They are usually labelled RTS meters. This means you could be charged for all your electricity at the day time higher rates, raising your bills. You will need to check with your electricity supplier asap what this means for you. You will probably need a Smetz 2 smart meter installed by them, which can be set to switch between rates. The switching uses mobile phone signals to transfer your electricity reading to your energy supplier. Poor Mobile Reception? Your energy supplier is obliged to leave you with a functioning metering solution. Please, if you think you may be affected, do not delay. Ring your energy supplier and find out what may need to be done to keep you on dual rates. More Information: from your energy supplier, the Energy Savings Trust, Age UK or Citizens Advice bureau. Also beware scammers. Only work through your energy company. Christine Marshall

Thinking of Solar Panels? NNDC has negotiated a £500 per household discount on solar panel/battery installations which are undertaken by a trusted partner company called MakeMyHouseGreen. If panels/battery are suitable for your property, then solar panels can reduce energy bills, reduce CO2 emissions and can mostly cover their installation costs in 6 – 8years. They can last in excess of 25 years, and offer a good payback.
