Speeding Motorists in the Parish: Spring is slowing arriving and with the evening light pulling out, people are spending more time outside in the community, going for walks, maybe with the dog, cycling, exercising and just enjoying the fresh air. But has anyone else noticed the increase in vehicles speeding through the villages in recent weeks or is it just me? I am presently responsible for the movements of the S.A.M. speed camera in Fulmodeston which is moved every 3-4 weeks across the 4 pre-approved sites in the village, with a second S.A.M. camera also positioned in Barney being regularly moved too. At present the Fulmodeston camera sits on Croxton Road very close to my home and every day, on multiple occasions I can see it flashing warnings of 34/35mph and more! Some of these are vehicles passing through our villages, commuting, delivering etc, some are drivers who are residents in our villages. I even spotted a driving instructor this week going through and setting the camera off at 34mph, some example for their students! Slow you down Buh? This issue has been raised several times at the Parish Council meetings, we are presently exploring options for additional signage to try and ask drivers to slow down and respect the speed limits. I have also attempted to re-establish the Community Speed Watch across the Parish but unfortunately, we could not quite reach the minimum numbers required. Maybe this is worth another attempt, would you be interested in helping out? Or do you have any other comments or experience of speeding vehicles going through our villages? There are a great deal of parish members who have a radio tele-switch (RTS) electric meter to control their hot water and storage heating systems. These meters offer cheaper electric rates at certain times of the day normally 11pm-7am and are sometimes known as economy 7 or 10 meters. Please note that on June 30th the signal which has been provided by radio 4 using radio signals to switch between peak and off-peak rates will be switched off. These meters will then not function correctly. Your energy supplier, such as EDF, Octopus, British Gas etc. should be in contact with you to discuss your options, if not I advise you give them a call. *David Webb* 07973706349
